Council proposes bylaw changes

The Buller District Council is currently consulting with the community on proposed changes to two bylaws.

The Council is proposing changes to the existing Stockdroving bylaw. The proposal will see the existing bylaw replaced by the Livestock Movements Bylaw 2010. The purpose of the livestock movements bylaw is to improve the control and management of movement of livestock on public roads.

The Council is also proposing a change to the Parking Restriction Bylaw (NZ9201 Part 25 Traffic). The purpose of this proposed amendment is to extend the restricted parking area on Palmerston Street. The proposed change would see the 60 minute parking restriction currently from Henley Street to Wakefield Street extended to Rintoul Street.

The above bylaws with proposed changes are available for inspection at the offices of the Buller District Council in Westport and Reefton and the Karamea Information Centre during normal business hours. They can also be viewed on Council's website www.bullerdc.govt.nz.

These proposals are open for public consultation with submissions closing at 4pm on 4th August 2009. Submissions can be sent to Manager Operations, Buller District Council, PO Box 21, Westport.
